Valentine's Day and Food/Gifts

- We reminded the students this week that we do not allow food deliveries during the school day (i.e. door dash, uber eats, pizza delivery etc). This causes too much disruption and places too much burden on staff to help facilitate the logistics of it.
- We also have seen an increase in Dutch Brothers, Starbucks, etc. in the morning. We also did a friendly reminder to students their
 coffee beverages need to be consumed before entering the building, or in the cafeteria, and cups need to be disposed of in
 proper containers and not left sitting on tables. Thank you for any reinforcement of these expectations you might provide to

- Transportation has asked we remind families of the expectations below, especially as we look forward to Valentine's Day and the
 gifts students may want to give to each other.

No Food or eating of any kind on the Bus especially hard candy (choking hazard)
