General information to help with getting started:

First day of school: The first day of school for all students is Tuesday, August 30th. Upon arrival, students can get a copy of their schedule out front. If eating breakfast, the cafeteria will open for that at 8:30. Doors open at 8:55 for students to go to their first period class. We are excited to see EVERYONE show up the first day!

Bus Information: Information on bus stops is provided in this newsletter and on the district web site. We recommend students ride the bus in the morning on the first day so they know their stop and bus number to go home. It is also a great start to meeting their driver and learning the routines for bus riding. It is helpful that your student knows their address, so please practice with that information prior to the first day of school.

First Day Packets: We will be sending home a First Day Packet for parents to go over that includes all of the forms that need to be filled out, signed, and sent back to school. The **required forms** are the VPS 1:1 Technology Responsible Use and Safety Agreement, The Alki School/Family Compact, 2022-23 Family Income Survey and for **6th grade students only**- the Attendance Agreement. Please go over these forms the first day and return them to school on Wednesday to ensure the school has all the information we need regarding your child.

School Hours: 9:00-3:30 on Tuesday-Friday. Mondays we have an early release so teachers have dedicated time for collaboration. School hours on Mondays are 9:00-2:50. Breakfast is provided starting at 8:30 daily in the cafeteria.

Breakfast and Lunch: Again this year, Vancouver Public Schools has obtained a grant to offer breakfast and lunch to any student who wants it free of charge.

Transportation: Parents bringing your child to school: Please see the PARKING LOT information sheet on page 9 of this newsletter. We work very hard to make Alki safe for all students, and drop off and pick up in the parking lot tends to be a place where we need a system to maintain order. Any time you are dropping off or picking up, please **pull forward as far toward the front of the gym as you can**- this will create room for cars to pull into the parking lot from the road and reduce back up. THANK YOU!!

Bikes and Skateboards: We request students on bicycles walk their bikes to the bike rack once on campus. There is a rack in front of the South House near the basketball courts, and one near the bus drop off area in front of the gym. **Skateboards and scooters are not allowed on school grounds in current school board policy.**

PTSA: Our wonderful PTSA does so much for our students at Alki. They provide funding for enhanced learning opportunities, support for classrooms, support for the 8th grade end of year celebration, and more. It would be great to have ALL of our Alki parents and students join the PTSA. Please look for the membership information in the first day packet, or stop by the PTSA info table on Back to School Night! It's a great way to support your student and get involved in the school.

Also, the PTSA board currently has an opening for President. If you are interested in taking on this important role, please contact the school so we can connect you with the PTSA board. There is a current Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, so you would be joining a wonderful group of supportive parents who are already working to support the staff and students through the PTSA.

ATTENTION VOLUNTEERS—

Have you been thinking about volunteering at one of our district schools? The district has now made the process very easy! Go to <https://vansd.org/volunteer/> and follow the instructions from there. Volunteer clearance is good for two years. Washington residents can take as little as 5 minutes up to 48 hours and Oregon residents can take up to 12 weeks to receive clearance back! Please make sure to apply ASAP if you are interested in volunteering or attending a field trip with your student this school year.

IMPORTANT TDAP BOOSTER FOR ALL STUDENTS IN 7TH & 8TH GRADE

Students must be fully immunized **prior to** the first day of school which is Tuesday, August 30th. As a reminder, a Tdap booster dose is required for all students in grades 7-8. For students in 7th and 8th grade, Tdap dose is acceptable if given on or after 10 years age.

Please submit medically verified immunization records to our school Nurse, Joy Feltz or our school Registrar, Kelly Newcomb. You may bring them to the office or send them or via email - joy.feltz@vansd.org or kelly.newcomb@vansd.org. **Please submit these documents by August 29th.**

Students who are out of compliance will not be allowed to attend school and will be withdrawn until their vaccinations are up to date.

MAKE SCHOOL COUNT: ATTENDANCE MATTERS, YOU MATTER

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school and themselves. Building this habit starts with the first day of school so they can learn right away that arriving at school on time, every day, is important. Good attendance is critical to school success. The parent is expected to notify the school of the reason for the absence within three (3) school days.

To excuse an absence at Alki Middle School:

- A written note by Parent/Guardian stating the date(s) and reason for the absence.
- Call the attendance line at 360-313-3220
- E-mail Attendance Clerk at AlkiAttendance@vansd.org
- Skyward Family Access request for student absence

Absences can be excused for the following reasons:

- Illness (a doctor's note is required after 5 absences)
- Health care appointments (as much as possible, try to schedule these outside the school day)
- Emergencies
- Religious activity
- Pre-arranged approved activity (family vacations **must** be pre-arranged to be excused)
- Family Related

All absences, whether excused or unexcused, become a problem for student success. At five unexcused absences within the school year, the "Unexcused Absence Report and Agreement" begins. Ten or more unexcused absences within the school year will result in the school district enforcing the compulsory school attendance law through truancy court.

When picking up your student from school it is required by VPS to have your ID ready and you must be on the student's approved pick up list.

Parents can now "Request an Absence" for their student. This can be done through Skyward Family Access.

Due to the importance of student's academic class time and school safety, students will not be excused from class until Parent/Guardian is in the office to sign them out.

Please review Alki's Tardy Policy:

- * 1st Tardy - Verbal warning
- * 2nd Tardy - Parent is notified via e-mail
- * 3rd Tardy - Lunch detention assigned to student
- * 4th Tardy - Referral to the office for his/her total and discipline will be assigned. Parent is contacted.
- * 5th Tardy - Referral to the office for After School Detention. Parent is contacted.

This survey provides your child's school a way to collect household income information. This information makes sure your child's school receives the full amount of federal and state funding and makes sure your child receives services they are entitled to when free/reduced price applications are not collected.

The Family Income Survey will be sent electronically to all families and a paper version will be included in first day packets. You can also obtain a copy in the school office. Please complete the survey online or return completed paper surveys to the school office by October 1st.

Parents and guardians need to complete only one survey for all school-aged children in their household. For further information, please call 360-313-1190 or email nutrition.services@vansd.org.


PARKING LOT SAFETY- Parent Drop off and Pick-up

Dear Alki Families:

In order to minimize hazards to students we are asking drivers to follow these procedures to ensure a safe pick up and drop off in the Alki parking lot:

- Pick up time in the afternoon is 3:30-3:40
- Please only travel east to west in the driveway when picking up and dropping off, then turn left to head south toward the exit, avoiding the first aisle.
- Pull as far forward as possible and continue doing so as cars pull out. We will be asking students to wait further west on the sidewalk rather than in front of the office.
- Form ONE line next to the curb when waiting in your car. Do not stop in the middle of the driveway to pick up or drop off your student.
- Remain in your car unless you are parked in a parking space
- Please find a parking space if there is no room along the curb. Students will be asked to use the cross walks to get to the parking area.
- Do not park or stop your car in front of any ORANGE CONES.

Please be aware that school zone traffic laws are in effect all year. Watch for the yellow flashing light and remember to slow down—20 miles per hour—and stop at crosswalks whenever students are present. Use caution when entering and parking in the Alki parking lot.

FREE - After School Fall and Winter Dance Sessions

Each session lasts eight weeks, so students receive eight hours of extracurricular dance education.

During the program students hone their technical and creative skills as dancers. Students in the program are able to learn specific styles of dance.

Not only do students get to explore the technique of dance, but they also have the opportunity to create dances with other students. Students are encouraged to collaborate while exploring and choreographing based on various stimuli. It is an amazing experience for students to work with students from other schools who share their love for dance.

At the end of the sessions the students have a chance to show their families what they learned and perform to a real audience.

The program is open to students in grades 3-8. Classes are one hour once a week. Students should wear comfortable clothing that allows them to move freely. Special dance shoes are not necessary, but students may wear them if they wish.
